WELCOME TO THE GALLERY WITHOUT WALLS

Gallery Without Walls is the City of Lake Oswego's nationally known public art program. Open year-round and free for everyone to enjoy, the Gallery Without Walls outdoor sculpture exhibit includes over eighty permanent and rotating works of art. The rotating exhibition features twenty-three sculptures on loan from artists for two years, most of which are available for purchase. All other artwork in Gallery Without Walls is part of the City of Lake Oswego's permanent art collection.

The Gallery Without Walls is never static. Each year between ten and fifteen new works of art enter the

collection as others leave, so there are always fresh sights to see—particularly in downtown Lake Oswego. This year's cohort of artists all work within the Pacific Northwest, and range from traditional metalcraft to engraved plexiglass, from representational art to the abstract.

ARTS COUNCIL OF LAKE OSWEGO: WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO

The Arts Council of Lake Oswego is a 501(c)3 nonprofit working to ensure the arts are an integral part of life in our community, now and into the future. Our purpose is the placement and preservation of public art in Lake Oswego, to provide access to art exhibitions for residents and visitors, and advance lifelong learning about the arts through educational programs and docent tours.

The Arts Council of Lake Oswego (ACLO) works in partnership with city agencies, local businesses, and community members to bring sculptures to the City of Lake Oswego, resulting in free, publically-accessible art that adorns the streets. Each year the ACLO adds new pieces to the collection, rotates some out, and performs necessary cleaning and maintenance to guarantee the art's beauty and longevity.

Support from the community is vital to our work. Our exhibitions, educational programs, and community-based events are free and accessible through vital funding from community members and visitors like you. There are many ways to give, and everything helps. *We can't do it without you!*



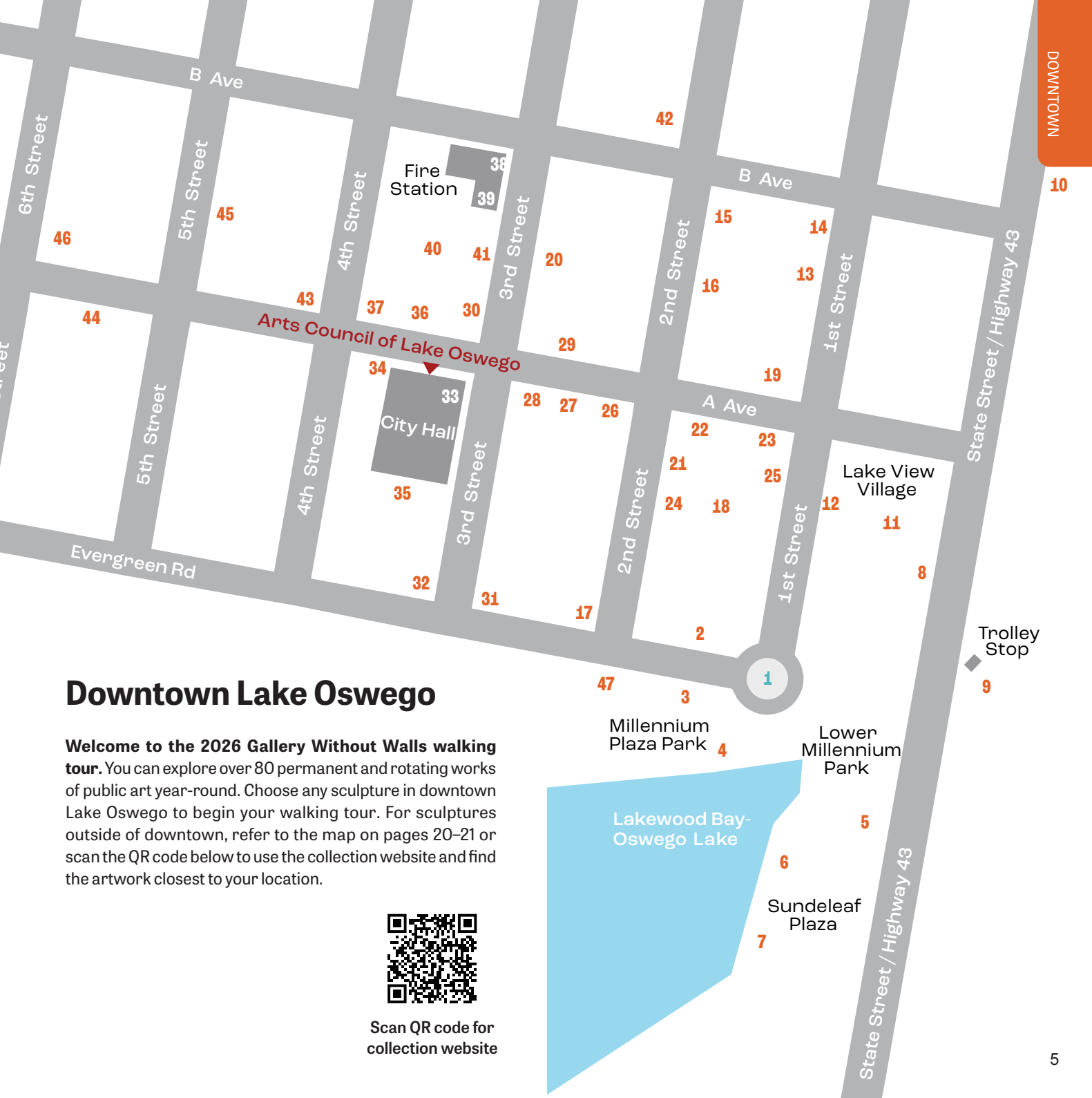
In addition to the Gallery Without Walls exhibition, ACLO runs Artspace, a fine gallery at 380 A Avenue in downtown Lake Oswego.

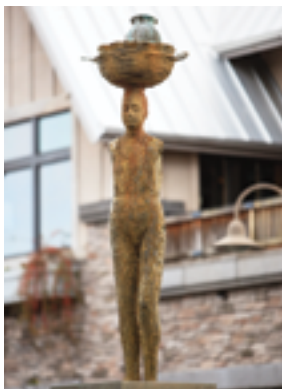


Downtown Lake Oswego

Greater Lake Oswego

The history of art in Lake Oswego spans several decades. In the 1960s a small group of citizens presented their first art exhibit in the Lake Oswego Library. Art became a priority for the City, which resulted in the establishment of the Lake Oswego Arts Commission in 1992. Operating as a Commission for the City Council, this group accomplished many outstanding art projects, including creating the city's permanent art collection and creating the first outdoor rotating sculpture exhibit, Arts Downtown, now known as Lake Oswego's Gallery Without Walls. While downtown holds a concentration of public art, there are sculptures all over greater Lake Oswego. Explore!

Lake Oswego Recreational Aquatic Center (LORAC) is now the site of several sculptures in the Gallery Without Walls. The orange numbered sculptures are all located there.
